Douglas B. Matheson, 69, born on May 12th 1950 to Joe and Carol (Parker) Matheson in Eugene Oregon. Doug spent the first chapter of his life in Eugene, he graduated from Sheldon High School; where he engaged in a few sport activities but was more interested in history and the day to day news of the world. These interests are where his adventure began. He attended Lane Community College and took classes in business for two years before losing interest completely. His "thirst" for adventure and knowledge grew far beyond the confined walls of his community college. Which soon took him on his first trip across historic Europe, then throughout his life he traveled from the tip of Alaska to the northern borders of Central America.

In 1974 he met the love of his life Carol while on another adventure to South America, they had their first and only child Christy in 1975, and together they spent most of their life in Alaska, Oregon and Washington. He started a career in construction on the North Slope of Alaska on the Alaskan Pipeline which led him throughout South East Alaska. Eventually he started his own business as a general contractor for residential homes. Doug loved building and the challenge of fixing anything that was broken. He and Carol built several of their homes, a float house, a house on an island, a 32' fiberglass boat, a Mexican block house in Mexico to their last home in Arizona. Later he went on to spend the remainder of his life in Mexico and then would move onto his

final resting place in Arizona, where he would pass peacefully with his loving wife of 45 years, by his side. He had a rich and full filling life. Doug is survived by his wife Carol, daughter Christy, 3 grand children Carissa, Sara, Daisy and soon one great grandchild who has yet to be named. A memorial service will be held 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 11, 2019 at the Jericho Faith Center.
