



Elizabeth Ann Madison

May 31, 1940 - June 24, 2015

Elizabeth Ann Madison died on June 24, 2015. Ann Madison was born Elizabeth Ann Seymour on May 31, 1940 in Baltimore, Maryland to Blanche Winters and Charles C. Seymour. She graduated from Western High in 1958 and obtained her bachelors degree in nursing from the University of Maryland in 1962. She got a master's degree in nursing and counseling from the University of Pennsylvania in 1964. In 1965 Ann married Russell Lee Madison and was divorced in 1968, without children. She received a PH.D in Human Development from the University of Maryland in 1973. Dr. Madison taught in the University of Maryland School of Nursing at the bachelor's and master's levels for sixteen years before becoming Assistant Dean of Academic Service's. Upon retirement in 1988, Dr. Madison moved to Arizona and with a good friend raised several horses, goats, chickens, dogs and cats. Since 2004 she has been a Volunteer with the Charles Wm Leighton Jr. Hospice in Willcox where she has cherished both the mission of the Hospice and its staff. She is survived by her sister Jane Winters Seymour King, a nephew CDR Scott Luers, USN and his family, a niece CDR Ann Casey, USN and her family, and her close friend Diane Pickthall. A former student described Dr. Madison as "a gentle soul with steely standards". A member of the Hospice staff described her as "tough inside and warm and fuzzy on the outside".
