Freddie L. Givens died at his home in Willcox on January 19, 2018 at the age of 75. He was born in Littlefield, Texas on August 10, 1942 to Alvin Givens and Rosette Bates Givens. Freddie was a veteran of the United States Navy, he was a electrician for El Paso Natural Gas for 32 years, was an ordained minister, served in the prison ministry for 22 years and served as Co-Pastor for Harvest Ministries for 7 years. Freddie was a member of the Willcox Church of the Nazarene. On March 31, 1973 in Casa Grande, Arizona he married Diana Raney who survives him.
