Gary C. Fletcher of Willcox died November 12, 2015 in Tucson at the age of 74. He was born May 5, 1941 in Somerville, New Jersey to Douglas Fletcher and Margaret Peterson Fletcher. Gary retired after 20 years with the United States Air Force as a TSGT in 1981 and served during the Vietnam War. On June 22, 1968 in Everett, Washington he married Penny Anderson who preceded him in death on February 6, 2013. After his retirement Gary worked at Oasis Video in Willcox, and was a bartender at the Cowboy, Palace and Cattle Rest Bars. He enjoyed working on motorcycles, making candy and was an accomplished artist in chalk and pencil drawings. Gary is survived by his daughters Karen (William) Geyer of Millington, Tennessee and Tracy (Chris) Rhoades of Willcox along with 7 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild. 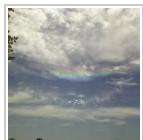
