Greg Wayman of Rodeo, New Mexico died near Douglas on January 8, 2019 at the age of 70. He was born in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania on January 29, 1948 to Wilbur Wayman and Elmyra Haynes Wayman. Greg was a Vietnam Veteran , serving in the United States Army. He retired from the Ford Motor Company. Greg was a member of the United Auto Workers Union in Ohio, VFW # 452 in Lorain, Ohio and the American Legion Post #11 in Douglas and was a Legion Rider. On July 20, 1968 in Lorain, Ohio he married his wife Stephanie "Stevie" who survives him. Also surviving is his daughter; Michelle Wayman of Lorain, Ohio and is son Josh Wayman of Hobart, Indiana, he is survived also by his grandson Jacob and great grandchildren Danielle and Rylee. 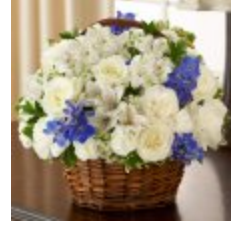

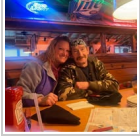
