Jill inspired everyone she came to meet and know. Her perseverance throughout everything she endured would put the strongest man in the world to shame. She had the most amazing laugh and smile that would light up an entire room.

Jill grew up in Kansas with nine brothers and sisters. Being the oldest girl she helped her mother care for the rest of the family. That is where she learned to cook and bake, and continued this tradition throughout her life. Jill's skills in the kitchen were bar to none, although it was hard for her to tell you a recipe because she knew them so well she didn't have to measure. Jill played many sports growing up, and was good at them all.

Kansas is where she met Rick her husband of 42 years. They were high school sweethearts and were madly in love. Jill and Rick married on July 14, 1978. They continued to live around Kansas/Nebraska area while they farmed and raised livestock. In 1979 they had their first son, Travis. A little over two years later they had their second son, Justin. The boys were their life, and in 1987 they moved to Cortez/Dolores, CO. Justin was in Kindergarten and Travis was in 3rd grade. Rick and Jill bought a saw mill in Dolores, CO and

started running the family business with the boys. The boys played football and wrestled. Jill was their biggest fan, and you can routinely hear her on the recordings of the games and matches screaming with pure joy and excitement. She never missed a game or a match. She loved her family and they were her everything. Jill meant everything to them as well.

In 1997 Jill and the family were in a car accident and Jill was paralyzed from the waist down. Although Jill was going to be in a wheelchair for the rest her life, she wouldn't let that stop her from doing anything that she wanted to do. Rick and the boys made that happen with her. Meeting and knowing her you would have never known she was in that chair, other than you could see it with your eyes. After the accident Jill made sure she was able to attend the next wrestling tournament, and after that her youngest son won the State Wrestling tournament. Jill could not contain her excitement, and that is all anyone heard in that stadium.

In 2005 Jill, Rick, and Justin moved to Belle Fourche, SD to run and operate the town airport. Travis would move there shortly after and start an auto repair shop. The family over the years would often move or travel together. While in Belle Fourche Jill started raising miniature horses. She also welcomed four grandchildren there. After nine years the cold had gotten to the whole family, and so they all moved to Southeast Arizona for the warmth and sunshine. After getting the ranch in Elfrida, AZ Jill and Rick expanded their miniature horses and started to train and breed them. Jill would train her horses all day, driving them in the practice carts all around the big ranch they had. Rick had made trails throughout the property that Jill could work the horse's day in and day out. Overtime they would travel all over the country to go to horse competition shows. Jill worked hard to get her horses in shape and ready, as well as Rick's. Justin's kids started training and practicing with a few horses and were able to start joining Jill at horse competitions when they were four and five years old. Jill, Rick, Brody and Hailey all qualified for the National Miniature Horse Competition numerous years. Rick and Jill continued to breed their horses and expanded to well over 35. Each year was a new round of

babies, and Jill loved all of them.

Jill was the light that showed us the way, she could make you smile or feel better at any moment and always had words of encouragement to share, and a huge hug. She supported and cared for everyone around her and she will be deeply missed.

Jill is survived by her husband (Rick Peters), her son (Travis Peters), her son (Justin/Erin Peters), her grandchildren (Brody, Hailey, Colt, Rowdy), her brother (Kurt/Suzanne Schroeder), her brother (Lance/Carla Schroeder), her sister (Becky/Kenny Reed), her brother (Rodney/Sheila Schroeder), her brother (Michael/Grace Robb), her sister (Renee/Rick Beougher), her brother (Barry/Nicole Schroeder), her brother (Ted Schroeder), many nieces and nephews, friends, and loved ones.

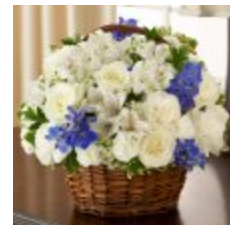
