Jimmy Clugston, of Sunsites died at home on February 9, 2014 at the age of 82. He was born in San Antonio, Texas on February 9, 1932 to William Albert Clugston and Tincie Juanita Standridge Clugston. Jimmy served in the U.S. Air Force during the Korean Conflict; he was a retired Mechanical Engineer for the Southern Arizona Veterans Hospital in Tucson and was the designer for the VA emblem at the Tucson Hospital. Jimmy was a member of Broken Arrow Baptist Church and was the artist for the Voice in the Desert Newspaper. On October 16, 1964 in Juarez, Mexico he married Ellen Duden who survives him. Also surviving are his children: Linda Dawnell McWilliams of Phoenix, Arizona, Kerry Dean (Nita) Clugston of Las Vegas, Nevada, Sharon Caroline Burnnet of Springtown, Texas, Jennifer Ann (Link) Luce of Las Vegas, Nevada, Walter Albert Clugston and Lee Edward Clugston both of Phoenix, Arizona. Jimmy is also survived by his brother Neil Armstrong Clugston, 15 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. Preceding him in death was his son Brandon Lee Clugston. Funeral Services will be 9:30 A.M. on Thursday, February 13, 2014 at Broken Arrow Baptist Church. Military Graveside Services will follow at 1:00 P.M. at the Southern Arizona Veteran's Memorial Cemetery in Sierra Vista, Arizona.
