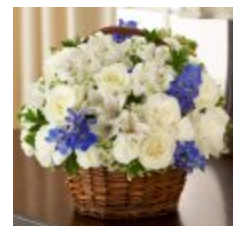


“ *In sympathy...

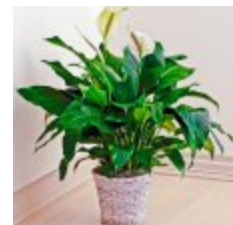

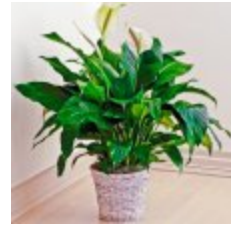
