John Moulder of Willcox died February 14, 2017 in Tucson at the age of 75. He was born in Inola, Oklahoma on July 11, 1941 to Cecil R. Moulder and Dellia C. Morton Moulder. John was a Willcox High School graduate, served in the U.S. Marines from 1958 until 1964. 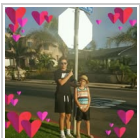
