“ my bobo gone to see jesus i know the first thing Richard will ask i want to read the bible he loved preached.plus he wants to see his mom and dad.he always had a memorial in his front room of his mom and dad pictures always.boy the times we had going fishing - camping- traveling alot delivering campers and the tail;s i can tell.one tail i can tell you not the best one but a good one to tell.we had to deliver 3 tent campers to st cloud minn and it so muddy and ground was so wet we could not set the tent campers on grass so the owner was very strick where you unloader them he told us to unload one a time on some gravel place which was very wet too so the first two unloading but the 3 rd was in the front nose of trailer and very hard to get it over the wheel wells we had to use a hand wrench to get at back of the trailer cause when the tenp camper weight 4 thousand lbs or more well i told richard dont stand at back of the trailer cause when it cleared the the wheel well it some went side way of the trailer sometimes it came off ok but every time would come off very fast down the ramp and stop with the bumper would stop when it hit the ground.well my bobo said he would catch it before it wass giong at a very fast speed the owner of the camper lot said to me is he strong or stupid.i had to tell him a lot of times stand away from the back of trailer he said to the owner of the lot im just on vacation the man got mad at him so we had a heated argument so from that day on i called him bobo.i could not understand that tent camper would run him over even us leaving the dealer ship he said he could lifted it up and carry it off the trailer.this is one story i wanted to tell.i got hundrens of them rain or snow any weather we had to unload our load.i just got to tell you this one we drove all day in ind ohio pa and we had a full load to deliver out east we drove all nite and i stoped at a truck stop in pa it was 3 am or 4am i was driving hard to get to deliver the load so i told richard to go lay down in one of the hideway pick up trailers on the front of thailer i climbed in the one truck camper on our truck i just got to sleep well a semi with two trailers came into the the parking lot just a banging all the bups in the truck lot had big chuck hoes in this lot an bot did it sound like a freight was comeing into this lot well anybody with and bouceing around on front of trailer would scare

you to death so when richard that he jumped out of the front camper and ran up to where i was sleep jerry were lot of loud sounds what was it told him it was normal for thucks to come in the parking and bang loud so he said im going back to bed i said ok.i look at my watch we just got there 1 hour ago so i went back to sleep.and i was sleeping good a short gray head man come to my unit jerry jerry jerry what you want now IM HUNGRY plese God save me from my bobo.ill always miss him he was one person you could thus and love jesus he was part of my family for over 20 years or more he love to travel and see things at funials peope say the loved one went to heaven i know for 100% he made it he was baptized in Jesus name got the holy ghost and spokein touns as the holy ghost in ACTS 2;38 only way to be saved by the bible way just think people today say no God or matt 28;19 titles no name THEIR HUG THINK AND PRAY ABOUT IT.
