Fargo Graham 1932-2020

Ronald Hugh "Fargo" Graham started life on a ranch in Montana. At age 14 he took his Grandfather's mule and they found him a month later in Mexico. He had a mind of his own even as a youngster.

As soon as he was of age he joined the military where he was with the 5th Highland Signal Corps.

He eventually got a job at the Grand Canyon, where he worked several years with the Pack Mules taking supplies to the base of the Canyon to the Lodge and Cabins.

He settled in Tucson in the early 1950's and due to the hustle and bustle of City life, over 30 years ago he chose to settle in Willcox where he could enjoy the Peace & Quiet on his ranch with a Million Dollar View of the Chiricahua Mountains.

In his lifetime Fargo worked on over 177 Western Movies, as an Actor, a Set Dresser and Livestock Wrangler.

He worked with John Wayne, Steve McQueen, Lee Marvin and many more too numerous to mention.

People come and go and we don't have as say as to when or where our time will be.

When our time is finally up, we are bound to leave a mark in another person's life one way or another. But despite the little time spent together, what matters

most is how you made all those years, months and days count.

When we lose someone, remembering them is the most beautiful picture our minds can paint, and nothing can ever erase them.

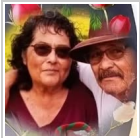
